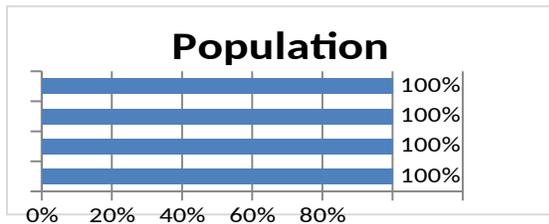


Profile of Graduates

The collected parameters to illustrate the respondent's profile have been classified into the number of respondents per year per program and the enrollment status.




The graph presents the total percentage of surveys gathered from the given sample size of students per program/per year. The entire graduates of BSCS students from 2012-2015 is 22, the sample size requires 4 respondents (1 respondent/year), and the total percentage of surveys gathered from the Bachelor of Science in Computer Science program is 100%.

The data presents that 50% of the respondents have availed scholarship in LCCB through the **Personnel/Employee** and **LCC Chorale** scholarship program. The remaining 50% are fee-paying students.


Job Acquisition




The data revealed that 25% of the BSCS graduate found a job within four (4) months after graduation. Another 25% was hired days before their graduation. 25% of the total numbers of Respondents indicated that after

graduation, the need to take care of a family member and to stabilize their health condition consumed much time and had to postpone any attempt to apply for a stable job. However, the data shows that the graduates of the BSCS program did not find it hard to find a job. Graduates of this program are expected to work as web developers, database and network administrators, and many more. The level of technical skills required is similar to that in other professions, such as engineering. Our Alumni are currently working in a global technological company and a service restaurant.


Current Employment Job Status




Knowledge of Job Vacancy



Types of Organization





Employment type




100% of the total number of respondents from classes 2013 and 2015 is currently employed and is working full-time in private companies here and within the region. It should be recognized that respondents came to know about the current job availability **Through Friends, Advertisement in Media,**

and through their On-the-Job training. The graduates relied on the information and referral from classmates and friends, and in all forms of media advertisement in acquiring the initial job.




The graphs above indicate that the job designation of the respondent per year varies. Respondent (100%) of class 2013 is currently on **Operational Level**, while fresh graduates are on **Assistant Level**. The graph further supports that the respondent designated in an operational level is currently earning an annual income rate of over 300,000php, an amount that is categorically higher than what is received by those who just graduated. It shows that the remuneration of the respondents increases as their length of stay and experience in the company progress as seen on the data above.


Job Challenges

Likelihood of staying on the Job




The graph on *Job Challenges* above presents that 100% of the total respondents from class 2013 affirmed that certain major problems surface in the current job assignment. However, respondent

managed to rate the current job standing as **Much** satisfied, and there is a great intention to remain in the same job/profession.

The respondent, who works as an Assistant staff in the accounting department, indicated that the job assignment involves sales computations and some accounting work. Admittedly, the respondent noted that the equipped knowledge for computer as BSCS graduate cannot meet the demand that her job description requires. It was also expressed that , “*In Computer Science we don't have an Accounting Subject but it's also a challenge for me to learn that specific position/job assignments and it's a plus point experience.*” This difficulty prompted the respondent to rate the current job reparation as **Much** satisfied although there was no intention to stay in the same job/profession.


Program Review

The graphs below establish the views of graduates regarding the study experience at LCCB in which supported their current employment and sought their assessments of the programs.



The Graduates were asked to rate the relevance of knowledge, skills and attitudes which enabled them the most in their professional careers. Overall, most of the respondents believed that their *Improved compassion for humanity & nature, Enhanced Spirituality, Improved Information Technology skills, and Improved Research skills* ranked first with a mean rate of 5 in giving BSC graduates competency in their fields, this falls in the highest range in a scale of 1-5 with the verbal description **Excellent**. It can be


interpreted that the respondents' consideration and empathy create a massive effect at work, especially how they contend with the employers and the coworkers. Their technological skills are competitive, and their ability to maximize their interpersonal and decision-making skills is efficient in their aptitude and performance at work.



When asked to evaluate the relevance of the education/programs and how qualified they feel at work because of the knowledge attained at LCCB, respondents' gave a mean rate of 5 in the following: *Enhanced Improved sense of nationalism, Improved Information Technology skills, Improved research skills, and Improved problem-solving skill*, that falls in the highest range in a scale if 1-5. The mean rating was assigned the verbal description of **Excellent**. It should be acknowledged that the graduates' beliefs and moral ethics have pronounced bearing at work because of the preparation acquired in LCCB.

There graduates gave appreciation on the Analytical, interpersonal, and decision-making skills that they have acquired here in LCCB. The data suggests that In terms of the academic perceptions, BSC graduates were highly satisfied with the qualifications and skills obtained from LCCB.

Strengths & Witnesses of the Program



The graph presents the major strengths and weaknesses of the institutional program that the respondents attended. A mean rate of 4.5 in *Teacher Student Relationship* was given by the respondents. The result falls in the high range in a scale of 1-5 and was assigned the verbal description of **Very Satisfactory**. The graduates established that the association and connection that they have regarded with their teacher became a factor as to how they were able to function and learn well in school. This aspect has contributed a lot in their totality while they were still in LCCB, it has affected their bearing as dependable individuals. We can conclude that the BSCS respondents have received benefit from their study, and have been satisfied with their education at LCCB.
